


Harry Mathews Collection Tour by Dick Spear

Shelby American Collection Tour by Dick Spear

On Sun., May 15th at 10:00 AM ZCCC has been invited by the BMW and Mercedes Clubs to tour the Shelby American Collection in Boulder.

The Collection is a unique and extensive collection of Shelby Cobra, Shelby GT 350 and Ford GT 40 cars, historical records and

memorabilia. The museum is dedicated to the preservation of Shelby American automobiles and to convey the Shelby

American team story to the public.

The Collection has prime examples of Cobra 427 S/C and competition models including one of only seven Cobra Daytona Coupes in existence. The Collection also includes the GT 40 driven by Mario Andretti at Le Mans in 1967.

In addition to Cobras, Mustangs and Ford GTs there are many rare prototypical and development parts, trophies driving and crew uniforms, artwork, models and other items of interest.

Here's how to get to the Collection. Take I-25 North from Denver to the Dacono/ Highway 52

exit. Take that exit and go west on Hwy 52. When you come to Diagonal Hwy 119 make a left turn onto Hwy 119. Stay in the left lane and get in the first left turn lane, approximately ½mile from the Hwy 52/Hwy 119 intersection. Make a left turn onto 63rd St. Go South, in the left lane, on 63rd until you come to Spine Road. Make a left turn onto Spine Rd. then a right turn into Chaparral Court. The Collection is at the end of Chaparral Court.

Come drive with us to visit historic Fort Laramie **April 30, 2005**, in South Eastern Wyoming




(depending on the weather). The Fort is an authentic U.S. Calvary Outpost founded in 1849 as part of the military presence along the Oregon Trail. We will be meeting at **9 am at the Wagon Road**

Park-N-Ride at 120th and I-25 (west side of I-25). From there, we will proceed up I-25 to Cheyenne, Wyoming. Just north of Cheyenne we will exit I-25, catch Wyoming Highway 85, and proceed east to

Torrington. We will continue on 85 until 85 becomes Wyoming Highway 26 at Lingle about 10 miles north of Torrington. From Lingle, we will continue North on Highway 26 about 11 miles to the town of Fort Laramie where we will exit Highway 26 at State Route 160 and cross the North Platte River for a quick 3 mile drive to the National Historical Site.

We will have lunch in Torrington. We will return home the same way until Cheyenne where you can either catch I-25 or go south on Highway 85.

Modifications to New 350Z

After reading and posting on this site for over a year, I think I can make some suggestions to new Z owners that will help them before they begin to modify their 350 Z's. I believe that if you follow some of these suggestions, you will reach your goals in modifying your Z with less frustration.



- 1. Define your goal. Are you simply trying to make your car look nicer, building it for street racing, drag racing, autoX, track, or a show car. Maybe it is a combination of more than just one of these, if so, be sure which one is more important because they may conflict each other.
- 2. Set your budget. You could easily spend in excess of \$25,000 on mods if you went with upgraded suspension, wheels and tires, and a Twin Turbo alone. Someone recently asked himself why he was spending so much money on modifying his

350Z when he could have purchase a Z06 Vette that will out perform his Z and the Vette would still have the factory warranty. Know what you want to achieve and how much you are willing to spend before beginning to modify your car.

- 3. Determine if you are willing to void your warranty from Nissan. Many suspension mods void anything related to suspension so if you spend \$2000 on coilover suspension, be ready to accept that Nissan will not fix your tire feathering problems found on many 350Z after 5000 miles with anything but stock or NISMO S suspension.

 4. Determine how much of a risk taker you are. A lot of people would love to have 500hp but how concerned are you about reliability. Your car has been designed stock to provide good performance with reliability. Nissan told their engineers to design the 350Z motor to last 200,000 miles. As a general rule, the more hp, the less reliability although some would argue that fact.
- 5. How long will you keep your 350Z? In many cases, most modifications do not bring higher resale and in many situations depreciate the cars value. I have already seen several nice 350Z's with modifications of over \$10,000 and then be sold off for parts bringing penny's on a dollar due to people selling their 350Z months after modifying it. Ask

yourself how long you plan to keep a 2 seater sports car. For most young couples, when the baby comes, the 350Z goes.

Once you have considered items 1-5 above, no experienced members on line that have specific expertise in areas such as stereo or wheels and tires. Use their knowledge and leave your ego off line. All of us can learn from someone else.

If you need my opinion on something, feel free to pm me and I will do what I can to help you. I suggest you begin modifying your Z in the following order:


