I have been informed that Tiffany Gordon has withdrawn from the VP position so now we will have 2 vacant positions on the Board after the election. I do not believe that either the Board or I have the authority to change the ballot at this point and I further believe that it will be up to the next Board to appoint a VP and Inter-Club Liaison after they have been installed on October 5. I didn't know that the proposed changes we made to the Constitution Art. II, Sec. 2 were going to come into play so soon.

We will be voting on the proposed ballot at the September meeting. If you want an absentee ballot to vote in the Board election, you must request one of the Secretary and return it to the Secretary before September 4, 2019

I had planned to say the following, but after talking to another Board member, I don't believe this is applicable now but is in the future: *As you can see, we still need someone to run for the Inter-Club Liaison position (and now the VP position too).* Step right up to the plate and ask what you can do for your ZCCC and not, what ZCCC can do for you, at least not in this instance. Let the new Board know you are volunteering for one of these positions and eliminate that uncertainty that presently exists.

As I write this, I believe that we should be discussing the revisions to the Constitution at the September meeting and depending on how that goes, voting on whether or not the revisions will be accepted by the Club and be incorporated into the latest Constitution. Only the proposed revisions will be discussed. BUT, upon a closer reading of the Constitution tonight, I find that the Constitution Art.III, does not provide for any discussion regarding the proposed changes to the Constitution, By-Laws, or Rules of Order. Discussion of the proposed changes is only provided for the changes to the Standing Rules. I don't know how long this provision has existed but in a strict reading of these provisions, it is clear to me that discussion is very limited according to these terms.

Based on this strict interpretation, we have violated this provision in the past as this is not the same process that has been implemented in the past when changes to the Constitution have been proposed. In the past every change was up for discussion. I believe we will need to discuss this quandary at the Board and Club meeting. We'll see how it goes.

Regarding the wording of the Constitution document, it's been my feeling for a while that several parts of the document needed to be clarified after at least two provisions were misinterpreted and subverted several years ago. While we were at it, our four person committee went over the entire document (and obviously missed some questionable wording) and came up with a lot of clarifications and specifics as to what must occur when a Board member leaves their position on the Board. Each position description has been clarified but I don't believe that these clarifications are substantive changes, but only to spell out what could have been misinterpreted based on the somewhat ambiguous language that exists. Under Events, Section 2, page 16 and 17, we have put in writing what the Board had previously decided about how active member points are awarded on multi-day events and for participation in ZCon. The policy set forth is how the Club has been awarding points for multi-day events since 2014 but due to missing updated versions of the Constitution we made sure that this time the decisions of the Board that have been previously accepted by the Club were memorialized

in this revision. Please read the revised Constitution that was sent out by email to every member and be prepared to discuss any proposed revisions about which you may have input and/or comments. If you disagree with the wording proposed, have a written version of your changes as you would like to see the wording.

ENOUGH ABOUT THE CONSTITUTION!! I know that more than a couple of members have noted that we don't have enough driving events. To that end, I have set up 3 driving events in Zeptember. See the "Mystery Drives" article elsewhere in this Odometer.

The ZCCC and Spartan College Wheels and Wings Showcase 2019 was a big success as far as Z Cars go with 20 cars being present and not so successful as far as other cars went. The Z's outnumbered all the other cars and awards were given to each model of Z, from the 240 to the 370. We even had 1 – 260Z and 2 – 280Z's. Mario Busnardo took 1<sup>st</sup> in 240Z, Scott Swiger was 1<sup>st</sup> in 260Z, Lee Hill took 1<sup>st</sup> in 280Z, Bill Lohringel was 1<sup>st</sup> in 300ZX (Z31), Ira Sanders took 1<sup>st</sup> in 300ZX (Z32), Fred Minister and Diana Inberg tied for 1<sup>st</sup> in 350Z and Ed McHugh and Tammy Sanders tied for 1<sup>st</sup> in 370Z. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places were also awarded if there were enough cars in the class. The Classic Trophy went to a 1926 Studebaker owned by Don Wait that was absolutely beautiful and has quite a story behind it. There were Ford Model T's, a Packard, a 1966 Charger, blown Challenger from about 1972, and near the end, a replica Auburn Boat tail showed up. Christopher Romano and Anthony Marmo from the college were very happy with the car show and that they got to show off the Spartan College of Aeronautics and Technology. We may have gotten a couple of new members and they may have gotten a new student. They want to do it again next year. Thanks to everyone that helped.

Here is another friendly reminder that the annual awards banquet will be held on October 5 at 3:00 pm at Cinzetti's in Thornton at I-25 and 104<sup>th</sup>. The costs are less than \$25 per person so the Club is not subsidizing active award member winners this year. We feel this is very affordable for all our members so a subsidy isn't necessary. The Board felt that the cost of a plated dinner or buffet at a nice hotel meeting room or event center has gotten out of control as it became impossible to keep the cost below even \$50.00 per person so this is our effort to make participating much more affordable. This is a club event to experience autocross, and is open to other car clubs/auto enthusiasts. Primarily the goal is to have a safe fun environment to perform an autocross timed event.

It is a great event for members regardless of driving skill and your cars performance level. It will be a timed short, small course full of twists and turns that will test proper braking and the vehicle's handling. Let's take advantage of the fun our Z's are capable of. A mistake may cause you to possibly need to buff out cone marks but no crashing into a wall or landing on rocks. Helmets will most likely be required and there will be a waiver to sign to participate. Closed toed shoes, long pants and long sleeves are required to be worn during your time around the course. I encourage everyone to invite spectators and other car enthusiasts. There will be enough space for cars to stage and more to show them off for those not trying the course. I think this will be good for the club to get our name out there and show we can autocross with the best of them. I'm working with AAA to possibly furnish the cones. They are really interested because coincidentally the head of the automotive department of AAA Colorado is passionate and already races in autocross type events. I'm waiting for their response but they could have a booth for signing up for AAA roadside assistance memberships and travel information.

The current projections for member costs is based on the number of people that have shown interest in participating. Right now its projected to be \$25-\$50 per person. The more participants we have, the lower the cost per person. I'm trying to get vendors so we have something to eat and drink. I'm looking to setup a tent with water and stuff for club members.

## Natl. Museum of World War II and Aviation Tour

We met at Cabela's sporting goods at 10:00 on Saturday morning and proceeded to Colorado Springs and the National Museum of World War II Aviation. We arrived just in time to take the 12:00 tour in spite of a navigation error by the event host. The tour started covering the history of WWII and the roll of aviation in winning it. We proceeded to the adjacent hangar where there were several pre-war and WWII vintage aircraft on display. We then went across the ramp to WestPac Restorations a premier World War II aircraft restoration and maintenance facility. There we saw several war birds that they had previously restored plus one undergoing restoration, a Navy SB2C Helldiver, which will be one of only two airworthy Helldivers in the world. The guide pointed out that all the airplanes on display are airworthy and perform at air shows. While we were there, a B-25 bomber and a Navy TBM Avenger returning from an air show landed and taxied up to the hangar where we were standing. Nate & Cheryle Derman, Andy Mortenson, Steve Robertson and Patty Troxell convoyed down from Denver and Rick Mraz joined us at the museum. I want to thank everyone for attending.

## Datsun 240Z Stock Paint and Interior Colors (US and Canada)

The most difficult to tell apart are 115 and 903 blue and 110 and 905 red although if you study enough and pay attention to the dates offered, you can get some clues. Only a few exterior colors were offered for the entirety of 240Z production – 918 orange, 904 white, and 901 silver. The others mostly switched over to slightly different colors for the start of the 1972 model year.
