At Beecher Island, southeast of Wray, there was a major Indian battle in September 1868 between Army volunteer scouts and the Arapaho, Cheyenne and Lakota Tribes that resulted in the death of Indian warrior Roman Nose and also the deaths of Army scouts and officers. This is just one of the historic sites we'll be visiting. There are more details elsewhere in this Odometer.



August is upon us and it is time to get a drive in for the summer. This multi-day, 400 mi road trip will take us to the Historic Beecher Island Battlefield, we will travel the South Platte River Trail Scenic Byway, and past the Historic home of Glenn Miller. We will start our prairie excursion Saturday morning 8:00 am at the Comanche Crossing Museum in Strasburg. The museum opens at dawn, and if you are there early, start your day with a scavenger hunt of the following ten exhibits and artifacts.

- Living Springs School (1891)
- Homestead House (1910)
- Wolf Creek School (1904)
- Strasburg Union Pacific Railroad Depot (1917)
- Authentic Union Pacific Railroad caboose
- Antique wooded windmill
- Antique farm equipment
- Strasburg's first fire truck (1917 Ford)
- Strasburg's original post office
- · Blacksmith shop

From here we are headed east to Beecher Island battlefield in eastern Yuma County. The plan is to be here at 12:00 for a picnic lunch. After exploring and eating lunch we will turn our compass north towards Holyoke where we will spend the night at the Cobblestone Inn and suites.

Sunday we are continuing our journey north to run the old pony express route. Then it is westward hoe to the town of Ft. Morgan where we will search for the childhood home of Glen Miller. Then it is a straight shot back to Denver.

This month's Z-licious recipe was requested by Debbie Carlson

Mushroom Lasagna

From Cook's Illustrated Magazine Serves 10-12

½ oz dried porcini mushroom, rinsed well

1 c. Water

2 lbs. [about 10 mediums] portobello mushroom caps, cleaned and cut into 2 x $\frac{1}{4}$ inch slices [Note: Grocery store had only 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. of portobellos so I used $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of cremini mushrooms for remainder of 2 lbs.]

4 Tbsp. Olive oil

Table salt and ground black pepper

2 large red onions, chopped medium [about 4 c.] (I like onion but this is to much so I use med-large onions)

8 oz. Button mushrooms, cleaned, stems trimmed, broken into rough pieces

4 medium garlic cloves, minced or pressed through garlic press [about 1 Tbsp. plus 1 tsp.]

½ c. dry vermouth

3 Tbsp. unsalted butter, plus additional for greasing pan

3 Tbsp. unbleached, all-purpose flour

3 ½ c. milk [regular or low fat]

1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg

1/4 c. minced fresh parsley leaves

1/4 c. plus 2 Tbsp. minced fresh basil leaves

8 oz. Italian fontina cheese, rind removed and shredded [about 2 1/4 c.]

1 ½ oz. grated parmesan Cheese [about ¾ c.]

12 no-boil lasagna noodles [generally one 8-oz. package]

½ tsp. grated zest from 1 lemon

- 1. Cover Porcini mushrooms with water in microwave-safe bowl; cover with plastic wrap, cut several stem vents in plastic with paring knife, and microwave on high power for 30 seconds. Let stand until mushrooms soften, about 5 minutes. Lift mushrooms from liquid with fork and roughly chop. [You should have about 3 Tbsp.] Strain liquid through fine mesh strainer lined with paper towel into medium bowl. Set mushrooms and liquid aside.
- 2. Adjust oven rack to middle position and heat oven to 425 degrees. Spread portobellos in even layer on rimmed baking sheet and drizzle with 2 Tbsp. oil, tossing to coat mushrooms evenly; sprinkle with ½ tsp. salt and ½ tsp. pepper and toss again. Roast mushrooms until shriveled and all liquid has evaporated, about 25-30 minutes, stirring halfway through cooking time. Set aside to cool.
- 3. While portobellos roast, heat 1 Tbsp. oil in 12-inch nonstick skillet over medium-high heat until shimmering. Add onions, ¼ tsp. salt, and ¼ tsp. pepper and cook, stirring occasionally, until onions are browned around edges, about 10-15 minutes. Transfer onions to large bowl and set aside.
- 4. Meanwhile, process button mushrooms in food processor until uniformly coarsely chopped, about six 1-second pulses, stopping to scrape bowl as needed. [Note: I don't have a food processor so chopping works just fine.] Heat remaining Tbsp. oil in now empty skillet over medium-high heat until shimmering. Cont. pg. 12

- 5. Add chopped button mushrooms and cook, stirring occasionally, until browned and moisture has evaporated, 6-10 minutes.
- 6. Reduce heat to medium and stir in porcini mushrooms, 1 Tbsp garlic, 1 tsp. salt and 1 tsp. pepper. Cook, stirring frequently, until garlic is fragrant, about 1 minute. Add vermouth and cook, stirring occasionally, until liquid has evaporated, 3-5 minutes.
- 7. Add butter and cook until melted. Add flour and cook, stirring constantly, about 1 minute. Add milk, scraping pan bottom to loosen browned bits. Add reserved porcini liquid and nutmeg. Increase heat to medium-high and bring mixture to boil. Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer until sauce reaches consistency of heavy cream, 10-15 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in 2 Tbsp. parsley and ½ c. basil.
- 8. Combine fontina and Parmesan in medium bowl. Toss cooled portobello mushrooms with onions in large bowl. Place noodles in 13 x 9-inch oven safe baking dish and cover with hot tap water; let soak 5 minutes, stirring occasionally to prevent sticking. Remove noodles from water and place in a single layer on kitchen towel. Wipe baking dish dry and coat with butter. Re-heat oven to 425 degrees.
- 9. Using rubber spatula, evenly distribute ¼ of mushroom sauce in bottom of baking dish; position 4 noodles on top of sauce. Spread another ¼ of sauce evenly over noodles followed by ½ mushroom-onion mixture and 1/3 of cheese. Repeat layering of noodles, sauce, mushroom-onion mixture, and cheese once more. Spread remaining ¼ of sauce over noodles and sprinkle with remaining 1/3 of cheese. Lightly spray large sheet of aluminum foil with nonstick cooking spray and cover lasagna. Bake until bubbling, 20-30 minutes.
- 10. While lasagna, is baking, combine remaining 2 Tbsp. parsley, 2 Tbsp. basil, and 1 tsp. garlic with zest in small bowl. Increase oven temperature to 500 degrees, remove foil from lasagna, and continue to bake until cheese on top becomes spotty brown, 5-8 minutes. Remove lasagna from oven and immediately sprinkle evenly with herb mixture. Cool 15 minutes, then cut into pieces and serve.


