Often, people are drawn to a car. This can be for one of many reasons; styling, horsepower, features, color and so much more. Also quite often, an enthusiast is drawn to the lineage of a particular car. Meaning they love that model of car across all of its iterations over its life span in being produced. As is the case with Travis and his love for Nissan Z cars. Here's a little bit about his obsession and his built Z car.

"The car is a 1991 Nissan 300zx Twin Turbo that I have had for 10 years. I have 4 Z cars from different years but this one had the most potential for upgrades and performance. For that reason and the fact it's a timeless body line and iconic shape I chose to pursue building it. It still has the original VG30DETT engine it came with from the factory. But it has been substantially built; pistons & rods, bigger turbos, ported heads, oversized intake and exhaust valves and now it dyno's at 615 horsepower. It has SPL titanium suspension components and a big brake setup. Soon I will get an E-85 fuel conversion done and eventually a retune.

I do some autocross and road course events with the vehicle and would one day like to put a roll cage in it. I try to take it to as many cars and coffees and shows as I can. I'm looking forward to the warmer weather and Cars & Coffee events!"

MEET YOUR MEMBER ROBERT EAGON AKA BERT-O-MATIC

The First Z I fell I love with! 1977 280Z



My first experience with a Z car was when I was 13 years old. My uncle had purchased a used 1977 Nissan 280Z, gave me a ride, and I instantly fell in love. Later in the mid 90's, I purchased my first Z, a 1976 280Z, drove that car to death. I think the hoonigans on the beach, and all the salt that came with it, did her in. One day, I opened the door and it would not close. The frame had rusted through and the body bent and sagged, so i parted her out for \$800. It would be a decade later when i purchased my 2nd Z, a 1990 300ZX, absolutely love it, still have it. As the Z line really started gaining the recognition it deserves, I started wanting to get an S30 again. I called my uncle, now living in Pennsylvania, who still had that '77, in storage and pickled for 20+ years. I convinced him to sell it to me, the very car I had my 1st ride in. So i hooked up my trailer to my Titan and road tripped it out to PA to bring her home. I already had a train trip to San Francisco scheduled, so as soon as I got home, I unloaded the 280 into the garage and went to Union station and boarded the train. Coast to coast without ever leaving the ground.

I have been a member of various Z car clubs, off and on, since the mid 90's. I have been a member of ZCCC since 2013 missing a few years here and there as life interruptions came and gone. I have been, and always will be, Z craZy.

In 2019 I received an invitation to travel to Japan with the ZCCA annual "Z craZies" trip. Most amaZing experience of my life. We toured the Nissan Motor Tochigi Plant, got to watch it give birth to a brand new Z34. We got invited to attend the press conference introducing Nissans new CEO, Makoto Uchida, at Nissans global headquarters in Yokohama. We then got a tour of the NISMO factory and the Nissan Heritage Collection, a private car gallery located in the Nissan engine manufacturing plant in Zama, and got to attend the Nismo Festival at Fuji Speedway, and Z Fiesta at Nissans private Grandrive proving ground in Oppama celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Z. Yes 2019 is the 50th in Japan as the 1st Z rolled off the production line in 1969. We also got to visit Liberty Walk, Tomei, Toyota Automotive Museum, Suzuka Circuit, and Ultimate Z. While at Grandrive, Nissan provided us Americans with some LHD Z cars to enjoy on the autocross and test track, one of them that I drove was a Pearl White 2019 370Z Heritage Edition, it was an amazing experience.

Upon my return to the USA, 10 days after Z CraZies Japan, as I was dropping off my 300ZX at Empire Nissan for an exhaust upgrade (fast intentions) I noticed out in the lot, a Pearl White 2019 370Z Heritage Edition, and was shocked, it was identical to the one I had just driven at Grandrive in Oppama 3 weeks prior. So I inquired about it, and instead of me Ubering home while they worked on my 300ZX, I drove that Heritage home.

For years I have been frustrated by the key fob of my 350 Z. Why? Since I have owned my Z, the icons on each of the fob buttons have completely rubbed off. Years ago, I inquired about an OEM replacement, but it was costly. I considered using sharpie to mark the buttons, but that is less than appealing. My daughter, Tiffany, also offered to cut the images on her Cricut machine, but the vinyl couldn't adhere to the buttons. I thought I was out of options and would just have to live with an unmarked fob. As I was unwrapping gifts this year, I was surprised to find two brand new fobs for my Z. Tiffany told me she bought them from Amazon by simply searching for "Key Fob Replacement for Nissan 350Z". It came with great directions and to make the gift even better, Tiffany programmed them for me. I watched her program it in less than 5 minutes. Now I have 2 new fobs and it feels like I got handed the keys to a new car. I highly recommend searching for your make and model on Amazon if you need a replacement fob. The brand is REMOTETIME and 2 fobs only cost about \$12 for both. Here is a link to the exact one I bought, if you are interested. https://bit.ly/3GPnZxm. The 2024 Nissan GT-R Is Here, and It's Old Enough to Get a Driver's License MOTORTREND - Rodrez Writer - Jan 13, 2023

Nissan's flagship GT-R sports car has certainly done its part in keeping the brand in enthusiasts' minds over the years. Although separated from the legendary Skyline family name, the twin-turbocharged, all-wheel-drive sports car that doubles as a grand tourer delivers mind-blowing performance that still holds its own against the fiercest of competition. But it's been a long, long time since the current GT-R debuted in 2007, and its luster is beginning to dull even after years of steady, if mostly minor, power upgrades and other tweaks.

Return Of The King?

With much of the auto industry turning its attention toward EVs, some feared the GT-R would soon be discontinued, never to make its return, while others have been busy creating renderings and suggesting that a potential new R36-generation version could be on the horizon. The good news is, the GT-R is back for the 2024 model year, and with more go-fast goods to be exploited—and definitely not dead yet. The bad news is, it's not all-new but once again a refined version of the previous model that many fans were hoping to

see totally revamped. A minor face and butt lift accompany aero upgrades, additional mechanical grip, and some much-needed visual flair for the trio of GT-R models. The most noticeable difference is the GT-R's new front fascia that adopts a boxier look, with the previous year's side grilles now integrated into the main grille opening and more modern, circular bumper lights at each corner. The upper grille appears slightly longer and sleeker, and Nissan says their engineers went as far as utilizing thinner mesh material to improve cooling and reduce drag.

In the rear, the area between the quad exhaust finishers has been toned down with a mild black mesh that blends into the two-tone treatment while the lower portion that wraps around both ends of the car is given an aggressive, somewhat complex look just behind the rear wheels. Perched atop the rear deck lid is a sharper version of the previous wing design.



T-Spec In Classic Colors

The **GT-R T-Spec** is back, and Nissan provides a look at the Millennium Jade version, a color borrowed from the very rare R34 GT-R V-Spec II Nur. You'll also have the option for the wildly popular Midnight Purple, which pays homage to the R34 GT-R V-Spec. Gold Rays 20-inch forged wheels are included and fit under the T-Spec's wider front fenders, while the NISMO model's carbon ceramic brakes are in place to improve stopping power.

The GT-R T-Spec is back, and Nissan provides a look at the Millennium Jade version, a color borrowed from the very rare R34 GT-R V-Spec II Nur. You'll also have the option for the wildly popular Midnight Purple, which pays homage to the R34 GT-R V-Spec. Gold Rays 20-inch forged wheels are included and fit under the T-Spec's wider front fenders, while the NISMO model's carbon ceramic brakes are in place to improve stopping power.

The same 3.8-liter, 24-valve, twin-turbo V-6 as before makes 565 hp and 467 lb-ft of torque. It remains hand-assembled, and sings through a titanium exhaust system. Nissan's ATTESA ET-S all-wheel-drive that varies its front-to-rear torque split is of course included, as is the speed-speed dual-clutch automatic setup with paddle shifters. Control over the Bilstein DampTronic shocks and driving modes, transmission action, and engine dynamics are all selectable via center console switches for complete driver control. If that horsepower figure isn't enough, or you're looking to step away from the already exclusive crowd, the NISMO model also returns for the 2024 model year. Using turbos derived from the GT3 racecar, the NISMO bumps the horsepower figure up to 600 and swells peak torque to 481 lb-ft and generates a noticeable improvement in throttle response. For the first time, a front limited-slip differential is brought into play to further increase grip, while larger brake rotors at a whopping 16.1 inches in the front and 15.3 in the rear increase braking and also shave over 30 pounds of mass.

The NISMO version also wears a more aggressive front end that mimics the lower part of the previous bumper with its upturned, exposed carbon fiber lower lip connected to an all-new middle and upper portion. Carbon fiber can also be found on the roof, hood, fenders, wing, side sill covers, and outer mirror housings. Moving away from standard style wing pedestals, this new NISMO version uses swan neck uprights, and its shape is said to further optimize drag and downforce. Fans who have been very vocal about the need for a new GT-R design after the nameplate's 16-year run will surely be disappointed to see yet another "new and improved" R35. The engineers have done a stellar job of picking the chassis and engine apart and finding new ways to make real world improvements, and Nissan reaching into its past for some iconic color options has helped keep things sort of fresh, too. The GT-R remains a formidable sports car, but also one that's getting just plain old, improvements or not. Like many of you, we're keeping our fingers crossed for something all new, but for now, you can view the live unveiling of the 2024 GT-R line here:



1975–1978 Datsun 280Z: Down 16 percent since October 2022

The buried lead here is that the 240Z—a car that has been gaining in value for seemingly forever—has been softening of late. However, the effect of that drop is more profoundly felt in one of the cars that followed it, the 280Z. As the 240Z climbed into the stratosphere, 280Z prices followed, as we'd expect given the principle of substitution. However, with the "real thing" now coming back into the realm of affordability for many collectors, there's less reason to settle for the rubber-bumper 280Z (even though, to be clear, many of us would be just fine with a 280Z, and appreciate the drivability improvements thanks to its fuel-injected engine).
