



MEET YOUR MEMBERS BOB AND DEBBIE CARLSON









Hi All,

This is Debbie Carlson, writing on behalf of myself and my husband Bob. I joined the club in (I think) 1985, but never actually attended a meeting until a year or so later. In 1984 I bought my then-boyfriend's car and fell in love with it. It was a baby blue '78 280Z with fake-Jaguar-like spoked wheels (hubcaps, actually) and had around 105K miles on it. One day I came out of work and found a flyer under my wiper blade. It was a promo for the Z Car Club of Colorado and I was intrigued, but didn't really think of myself as much of a joiner. Initially I joined as a Single membership to get access to parts and repair discounts and soon was receiving the monthly Odometer. It didn't take me long to figure out that these people liked each other and made ample time to have fun together, so I started going to meetings which were then held at Nissan headquarters located near I70 and Peoria. I became active with the club and in '87 I was elected Treasurer. In 1988 President Bob Rapparlie and VP Ben Millspaugh got this hair-brained idea to hold the first-ever national Z Car Club convention in Aspen, to create national interest, and made it happen. As Treasurer, I watched in amazement as checks from Texans kept rolling in. In the final analysis we had a total of 50 participants at the inaugural event, but it snowballed from there. (Oh, and the following week Bob & I were married.)

In '94 I retired the '78 in favor of an '82 280ZX. It was a two-toned royal blue and silver coupe and it was also one of the talking cars described in the May Odometer. Reading that article reminded me of "her". I referred to her as "her" because of the voice she spoke to me with. Several people had said to me, "It would drive me nuts to listen to that," but I told them that she saved my butt all the time by reminding me that "Lights are on." (I drive with headlights always on, day or night, and have needed a jumpstart more than a couple of times.) Both of those cars served me well as my daily driver for 10 or more years and were put out to pasture at around 210,000 miles.

My current car is a '92 300ZX which I acquired in 2007, but it wasn't roadworthy until early '08. It's a "dark cherry swirl" (cabernet-colored) non-turbo with T-tops and I thoroughly enjoy it. I can't guess what the future holds, but we hope to keep Z-ing you at the club. membership@zccc.org

AUTOCROSS - SATURDAY, JULY 24TH 8 AM.

What is Autocross? - A timed competition held on flat, paved surfaces with few obstructions such as parking lots or airport tarmacs in which drivers navigate one at a time through a defined course marked by traffic cones.

Autocross courses tend to place demands on car handling and driver skill rather than on engine power and outright speed. It emphasizes safe competition and active participation. Autocross differs from road racing in that there is only one car on the course, driving against the clock rather than other cars Because autocross events use rubber traffic cones to define the course, the hazards and barriers to entry are low. While speeds are generally no greater than those encountered in legal highway driving, the combination of concentration and precision maneuvering gives drivers an experience similar to that of a full road course race.

A few of you will remember the autocross event we held in the parking lot of the Aurora horse race track back in October of 2019 and how much fun it was.

Well, we've scheduled another autocross for the morning of Saturday, July 24th. The event will be held at the Adams County Sheriff's Department Training Center in Commerce City. The facility is located at 23600 East 128th Avenue which is about 5 miles east of Barr Lake.

We'll be using their nice smooth 3 ¼ acre skid pad for our autocross. We have rented the pad for four hours, from 8:00 AM until Noon. We're going to limit participation to the first 25 cars to register because we'd like to guarantee each car a minimum of three timed runs through the course during that time. There will be a charge of \$20.00 for each member and \$25.00 for non-members. Please bring cash or a check payable to ZCCC because credit cards can't be accepted.

Helmets will be required and the Training Center requires that a release form be signed by each participant. The center is in a treeless area and there is no shade so bring sun protection and drinking water. There are bathroom facilities within easy walking distance. So save the date and come on out and watch the fun even if you don't plan to participate. If there's insufficient participation from ZCCC members, the autocross will be open to the public to help defray costs.

Is the Nissan Z poised to become the next 911?

We are in the midst of a Nissan Z boom. You may be thinking, "Old news, the 240Z has been rising in value for years." Yes, it has. But here's the thing, we're now seeing it for *all* Z's.

We track seven Z generations in the *Hagerty Price Guide*, from the original that revolutionized the sports car market through the retro-styled 2003–08 Nissan 350Z. Every one of them increased in value last year. The traditional classics saw a substantial 25–35 percent increase, while Z's that were previously overlooked, the 280ZX and 300ZX, nearly doubled in value.

As we've mentioned recently, the collector car market exploded during the pandemic, with gains for just about everything from muscle cars to vintage SUVs; however, a rise in value this sharp and across such a broad swathe of generations is incredible. Not unprecedented, though. What particularly comes to mind is the air-cooled 911 buying frenzy of the mid-2010s. Is the Nissan Z the new 911?

Of course, the dollar figures are different, but note the similarities in the trends: The earliest and most desirable model sees moderate value increases every year and, once it crosses a certain threshold, sends collectors and speculators scurrying after the "next best thing." For Porsche, this point was when prices for the first-generation 911 crossed \$65,000 in 2012, then values for other air-cooled models took off. A rising tide lifts all boats.

We see the same thing happening with the Z. The classic S30 Z (240/260/280) has been steadily rising since 2015, but it wasn't until the median #2 value surpassed \$25,000 last year that collectors started looking for substitutes.

Another similarity: Collectors covet the most powerful versions. Just like Porsche's turbo model from Turbo in 1975 and Nissan giving the 280ZX a turbo in 1981. The 930 Turbo eventually rose past the original 911 to take the throne as the most valuable 911. In contrast, it's unlikely that the 280ZX will ever be worth more than the original 240Z. For one thing, it doesn't enjoy the power advantage. In 1975, the 930 Turbo made 85 hp more than the most powerful naturally-aspirated 911 at the time, compared to a 35-hp boost for the 280ZX. More important, the 280ZX doesn't have that 930 mystique. The 911 Turbo's reputation as a hard-to-tame "widow maker" is surely part of its wild growth in value.

Those who follow the Porsche market know that this appreciation trailed off and even reversed some in the latter part of the past decade. After all the dust settled, values for the top air-cooled models plateaued, while the "lesser" models enjoyed healthy growth.

Are we bound to see a similar correction in the Z market? While it's always possible for a car or segment to become overheated—especially if speculators get involved—it's very likely the Z will continue to grow in value in decades to come. See, the Z has one thing behind it that the 911 doesn't—youth.

It's no secret that younger collectors like Japanese cars, but that fact really comes to light when comparing the demographics of those who call us for quotes on insurance policies for the 911 and the Z. Both are practical and reliable sports cars that should attract younger buyers who often don't have the space to own multiple collector cars, but the Z still manages to capture far more attention from drivers under 40.

Looking at quotes from drivers currently under 25 (Gen Z), the contrast is even starker: They almost completely ignore the 911 and instead favor models that older generations often don't consider "true Porsches." The 924 and 944 are the only Porsche models for which Gen Z comprises more than 5 percent of quotes. By contrast, every Nissan Z receives a lot of attention from Gen Z.

Of course, price plays a role here. Most 911's are out of reach for young enthusiasts. Note, however, that even the 240Z—which costs more than most non-911 Porsches—gets much more attention from the youngest collectors. Also note that many of the 1960s classics on which baby boomers now spend six figures started as affordable used cars.

Porsche famously used to ask, "Did you spend your youth dreaming about someday owning a Nissan?" For millennials and Gen-Zers, the answer is "Actually, yeah." And with a new Z arriving soon, don't be surprised if even more of those young collectors turn that dream into a reality. We don't expect vintage Z's to pass 911s in value any time soon, but they now belong in the same conversation.
