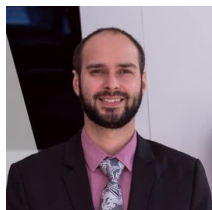


Congratulations - We have a new Club Sponsor

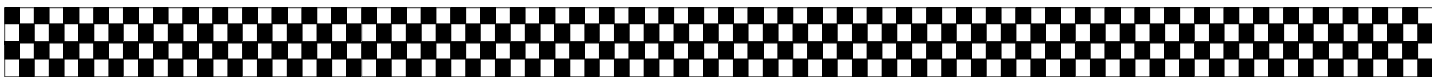

CONSTITUTION

Proposed Change to the Constitution...

Under ARTICLE II — Officers and Elections, Section 4 — Election of Officers

It currently states: Section 4 — Election of Officers

The election of officers, each of whom must receive a majority of votes cast, shall be held at the general meeting in September. If the nominated slate of officers presented at the general meeting in September is unopposed, the Board as nominated may be elected by general acclamation. Absentee ballots may be requested in writing from the Secretary and returned to same by mail prior to the election. Absentee ballots shall not be opened until the election meeting. The Secretary will assure that any member who has sent in a marked absentee ballot is not permitted to vote in person at the September meeting. All newly elected officers of ZCCC will be installed at the Annual Meeting and Banquet in October.

In the event of a tie, the ballots shall be recast with only those active members present at the meeting voting, until the tie is broken

To officially allow for electronic voting, the Proposed Amendment would add the highlighted statement below:

The election of officers, each of whom must receive a majority of votes cast, shall be held at the general meeting in September.

The meeting may be in-person or virtual and the ballots may be physical, or virtual ballots. Unless an absentee ballot is previously requested, only those members in good standing in attendance either in person or virtually at the September general meeting, will be allowed to vote.

If the nominated slate of officers... [all the rest remains unchanged].

Payment options for new subscriptions will be by check only at this time. If this is an issue please contact Jason Spegal to work out other options.

How the ZCCM works: The club renews its subscription with the ZCCM every February and receives a discounted rate of \$13.50 per magazine adjusted annually. New and renewing club members can sign-up for a full year of the ZCCM within the November to January time frame. 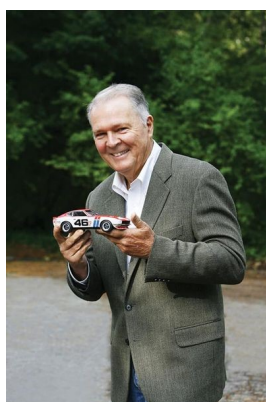

Early 1971 240 Z Original Paint Color

MEET YOUR MEMBER VINCE NICOLETTI

When the University of Denver still had a men's gymnastics program I was a nationally ranked all around gymnast on scholarship. Because I saved my father the expense of college he offered to buy me a car when I graduated. That car is my Z which I have owned since Spring 1971. At the time, there was a waiting list at every dealership in the state. I was number 400 on one of them when my father stopped in at Connie's Datsun in Sterling. He asked Connie (a male) about the silver Z in the showroom window and he told him that it had just been cancelled off the waiting list and that he would sell it to him if he could pay cash. Sold! Full price out the door including tax and license plate - \$4,100. The first thing I did with it after graduating was grab my brother and take him on a road trip to California. Because I abused it terribly I called it The Zeep (a cross between a 240Z and a Jeep). I used to take it off roading and would occasionally get high centered in bad snow storms. Nothing kept me from driving it virtually everywhere. Once I took it up to the mine entrance in Marble Colorado on a 4 wheel drive road. In order to get to that road I had to pass over a dilapidated bridge. I had to very carefully place old bridge timbers just wide enough to support the Z's width to get across. The undercarriage bears the scars of many a rock I encountered on my crazy youthful sojourns. Since we all know just how rust prone Z's are I had to have it repainted in 1978. Unfortunately the idiot doing the work took the cheap way out and just Bondo'd over the rust which continued to eat my Z. In the mid 80's when the Z had about 140K on it I had my friend John Von Tilius, who had worked as head mechanic at several Datsun dealerships, rebuild the engine and do some minor modifications. He also sprayed undercoating on the undercarriage which helped protected it from further rusting. It was my everyday drive until I got tired of high centering in the snow and bought a sensible car which really was a 4 wheel drive. That 88 Subaru was the start of the Z's downfall. I still drove the Z quite often at first but then less and less until it was difficult to start. It sat un-started and unprotected for about 10 to 15 years. It had 171,473 miles when I finally bought a shed to protect it in 2018. I began repairing it with the thought that I'd do just enough to get it running and then put most of my energy into doing a full, frame up restoration on a 1970 2000 roadster which I inherited from my Dad. I didn't realize the extent of the rust damage and had to begin a more thorough restore to revive it enough to be mechanically sound and drivable. 2019 was taken up with family health issues so I was not able to devote any time to the Z at all. 2020 turned out to be the year I really made progress. The improvements made back then: Bored out to restore compression, installed a semi-race cam, enlarged the valves and replaced valve sleeves, installed headers and a new muffler. The improvements currently being completed: Removed, replaced or repaired the front and back suspension, replaced the carburetors with Z-Therapy rebuilds, steam cleaned the gas tank and radiator, relined the gas tank and repainted both, replaced the alternator with one with a higher output, upgraded the coil, made the distributor electronic, replace the spark plugs and wires, bought 15 inch alloy wheels and new tires, bought new front turn signal units. The improvements planned for the future: Install rear disk brakes, install new brake master cylinders, replace all the weather stripping and window seals, replace the windshield, replace most of the lighting and get high performance LED headlights, install Carbon Fiber air dam, headlight buckets and bumpers and anything else that needs to be done to make it drivable. I hope to have it drivable by ZCON but that might be wishful thinking because of the extensive body work. I'm teaching myself to TIG weld and will lead-fill the body instead of using Bondo. To protect the undercarriage I'll use truck-bed paint and do part of the primer painting myself. After it's running I'll upgrade the interior piece by piece as I can afford it.

I've been a member of ZCCC since November 2018 when I decided the Z club might be where I could tap into information about how to restore and maintain the Z. I can't wait to do some of the club activities when my Z is finally drivable.

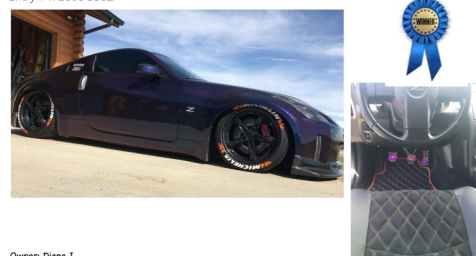

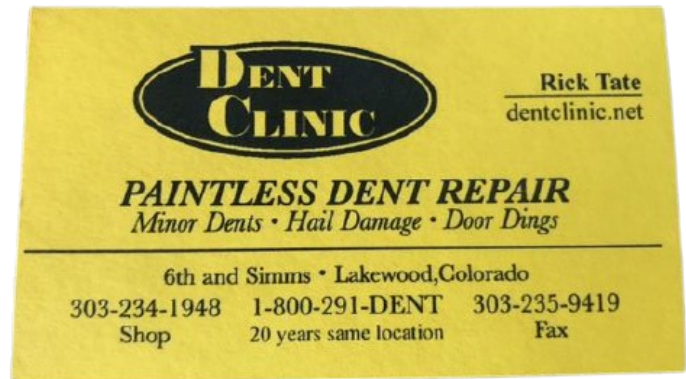

Nobody loves a shot, but it's worth a shot, if it's lifesaving. Many ZCCC members have questioned what the vaccine experience is like during and after inoculation, so we have a few testimonials to share with you.

I received the first Moderna dose on 1/9/202 I received the second dose on the afternoon of Saturday, Feb.6. My arm got more sore than the first shot but not bad and the pain is gone now. Sunday I had chills starting midday. My temperature was 100.3 I was OK Monday morning, but I had some more chills Monday night. My temperature was 98.9 so not bad. Today all is ok.. Matt M

My experience with the COVID vaccine has been pretty positive. I received my first Pfizer vaccination at UCHealth Anschutz Hospital in Aurora on January 15th with no side affects. I got my second shot at the same location on the morning of February 5th. I had no side affects other than feeling a bit fatigued that evening, but I was fine the next day. I have no known health conditions other than old age. I strongly recommend that everyone get vaccinated as soon as they are able....Andy M.

My first and second Pfizer shots were at UC Health. It was an easy and extremely safe and quick process. I was in and out for the second shot in less than 10 minutes with no side effects except a sore arm. There are at least 5 different websites you can register on. I strongly urge everyone to get vaccinated no matter your age, occupation or health condition....Cheryle D.



I received my first Moderna vaccine at The Westin at DIA for DIA employees. It was easy and I had no side effects....Nate D

Tiffany Gordon's Experience: I am in phase 1B, since I am an educator. I had the Moderna vaccine at Kaiser and it was an easy experience. The shot was painless. I did experience pain in my arm about 8 hours after the shot and it continued throughout the next day. I used some heating pads and took Tylenol to help suppress the discomfort. I'm so glad to be done with the first vaccine and I am looking forward to the second one.

Judy Gordon's Experience: I am also in phase 1B, since I am an educator. I had my appointment at a different Kaiser location than my daughter Tiffany and was given the Pfizer vaccine. The line was relatively short. They had me wait 15 minutes to see if I had any side effects, but fortunately I didn't experience any. It's been 24 hours and I am still feeling great.

I received my first dose of the COVID 19 vaccine on January 2. I was eligible as part of a partnership with Cherry Creek Schools. I was emailed an invitation from Centura Health and received my vaccination at Parker Adventist Hospital. All of the appointments were capped so as not to have a crowd of people and the entire process took less than 40 minutes.

The shot itself was no more painful than any other vaccine and the side effects I felt were mild. The day after the vaccine I was a little tired and achy. This lasted for one day and by the second day after the shot I felt fine. My second shot was on January 24th and I had about the same reaction as the first dose.

It has been more than 2 weeks from my second dose and I have not had any issues at all. I received the Pfizer vaccine and was not given a choice as to which I would like. That was just the one they were using the day that I was vaccinated...Cheryl M.

Z-Licious Bagels



For those that couldn't attend the Z-Licious Bagel event on February 27th, here is the recipe Tiffany Gordon shared with us.

Ingredients:

1 cup of Greek yogurt

1 cup of Self-Rising Flour

Egg (beaten for egg wash)

Toppings: Sesame seeds, everything mix, kosher salt for topping (or whatever you want to top it with)

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

2. *Option 1 if you have a stand mixer:* Put all ingredients in mixer until ingredients are combined and it has formed into a dough.

3. *Option 2 if you have no stand mixer:* Put all ingredients in a bowl, combine until dough starts to form

4. Spray a cutting board (or smooth surface) with cooking spray. Spray your hands with cooking spray (as dough is sticky). Put the dough on the smooth surface.

5. Form dough into a log and cut into 4 equal pieces. Roll out each dough ball to form a thick rope and pinch the ends of the rope together to make a circle. Do this to make all four bagels.

6. Beat an egg and brush over the bagels. Sprinkle with your desired toppings.

7. Bake at 375 degrees for about 25-30 minutes or until golden.

8. Enjoy.
