PROPOSED CHANGE TO THE CONSTITUTION

As stated in the Constitution, the proposed amendment portion is highlighted in yellow and will be discussed and voted on at our November General Meeting.

Section 4 - Treasurer

The Treasurer shall:

- 1. Have custody of all funds
- 2. Pay expenditures on behalf of ZCCC in accordance with part III Section 1 of these By-Laws
- 3. Give bond, at ZCCC expense, if required by the Board
- 4. Pay all debts on a timely basis upon approval of the President or another Board Member in the absence of the President, when receipts or other sufficient documentation for expenditure is attached
- 5. Receive and pay all debts in the form of reimbursement to Club members within a reasonable time upon receipt of sufficient documentation
- 6. Account to ZCCC quarterly by reporting to the Club and upon request from the Board, through electronic means, the Odometer and by oral reports at Club meetings regarding the financial health of ZCCC
- 7. Prepare and file the necessary taxes with the IRS by the due date (or file an extension by the date if additional time is required)
- 8. Update and submit Periodic Report (business in good standing form) with the Secretary of State annually by the required due date and pay any associated fees
- 9. Ensure at least two Board member signatures are recorded on all ZCCC bank accounts 10. Upon retiring from this position, the Treasurer shall deliver to their successor or the President, all records, check books, ledgers, electronic records, funds and all other items related to the monetary record keeping of ZCCC and any other ZCCC property in their possession. Additionally, the retiring Treasurer shall pass on to their successor or the President all information in their possession necessary to facilitate the smooth transition of the duties of Treasurer to their successor







Interesting Information about Rambler Ranch Vehicles by Andy Mortenson



This is a 1949 Nash model 3148 tow truck. Only about 5,000 pickup trucks were built by Nash between 1947 and 1954 and they were mainly for export markets. However, American Nash dealers could order them for their own use, and most that made it onto U.S. roads ended up as tow trucks like this one.



The gown adorning this mannequin was worn by Miss America of 1952, Colleen Kay Hutchins, who was awarded a new 1952 Nash Rambler like the ones in the foreground. Many years later, she gave the gown to her granddaughter who wore it to her high school prom. Interestingly, Miss Hutchins married Ernie Vandeweghe and had three children one of whom was Denver Nuggets star, Kiki Vandeweghe.

Brake Lights: Why Are They Red? By Bob Byrne

While we were touring the Rambler Ranch collection, the question was asked, "why are brake lights red?" Without a solid answer forthcoming, I decided to investigate.

First, a little information about the color red. It is a primary color, RGB. It is one of the first colors created by humans and has been used to denote heat, sin, sex, passion, anger, war, power, and danger. It is the color best seen in the dark by the human eye and at the greatest distance of any color. It is also a favorite color in nature for mating display to stop a potential mate in her tracks or to tell predators, stop, do not eat me, I am dangerous.

In regulatory parlance, the stop lamp is the correct name, though we all call them brake lights. In the early days of automobiles in Great Britain, a person waving a red flag had to precede the automobile down the road to warn horse drawn vehicles of the approaching machine. (By the way, both my Irish grandmothers called cars "machines" when referring to them.)

Drivers used hand signals to indicate turns and stopping before lights began to appear on cars. The actual brake light began to appear on cars in 1905 allowing automobile owners to drive their cars at night. The brake light was originally manually activated to signal the intent to turn or stop. By 1928, it was the law in 11 US states that cars had to have brake lights.

The third brake light was introduced in 1974 as the result of a 10-month study on driving attention by psychologist John Voevodsky. He attached a third brake light in the back window of 343 taxi cabs in San Francisco. At the conclusion of his study, it was shown that rear-end collisions were reduced by 60.6%. Drivers were better able to react to the car in front, slowing down with the third brake light closer to eye level.

Lighting on automobiles is subject to country-by-country regulation ad nauseum. Shape, color, location, intensity, and type of bulbs vary by design. The most consistent requirement of the brake light is when activated, it is always red and always brighter than any surrounding lamps.

In the past this has been a well attended party to launch the holiday season. The Dermans hope all members, guests and mascots will attend. It should be a festive and fun event.




