Proposed Amendment to the Constitution

Rules of Order
ARTICLE II – Meetings

Section 1 - Regular Meetings

CURRENT WORDING:

The regular monthly meetings of ZCCC shall be held on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Notice of any changes or cancellations of the regular meeting shall be given to all members of ZCCC. The Board may make temporary changes in the meeting location. A permanent change in meeting location must be approved by a majority of the members at a general meeting when the proposed change in location is voted upon. Prior notice by the Board to the Club is required by a posting in the Odometer of notice of the intent of the Board to permanently change the meeting location. That notice shall be given in at least two issues of the Odometer prior to the date of the proposed vote.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT CHANGE:

The regular monthly meetings of ZCCC shall be held on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m.

Meetings, including but not limited to the regular monthly meetings, Special meetings, Board meetings, and Annual Meeting, shall be held in person, virtual, or a combination thereof.

Notice of any changes or cancellations of the regular meeting shall be given to all members of ZCCC. The Board may make temporary changes in the meeting location. A permanent change in meeting location must be approved by a majority of the members at a general meeting when the proposed change in location is voted upon. Prior notice by the Board to the Club is required by a posting in the Odometer of notice of the intent of the Board to permanently change the meeting location. That notice shall be given in at least two issues of the Odometer prior to the date of the proposed vote.

REASON FOR PROPOSED AMENDMENT CHANGE:

To include additional methods of meeting communication.

Proposed Change to the Constitution

Several months ago, the General Membership voted to modify the dates shown in our ZCCC Constitution for collecting Active Member Points to read...

<u>Active Member Award</u>: A ZCCC member is eligible for an active member award if they accumulate 15 or more points between September 1st of any year and August 31st of the following year.

But then we realized point collection for the Most Active Member Award had the old criteria as follows...

<u>Current Most Active Member Award states</u>: Most active award is given to the ZCCC member who accumulates the most points in a <u>fiscal year</u>. In case of a tie, multiple active member awards will be presented.

So, it is being proposed that the ZCCC Constitution be changed from "fiscal year" to:

<u>Proposed Most Active Member Award would state</u>: Most active award is given to the ZCCC member who accumulates the most points between September 1st of any year and August 31st of the following year . In case of a tie, multiple active member awards will be presented.

This refers to the section of the ZCCC Constitution under STANDING RULES, Section 2 – Awards, page 16.

The General Membership will get to vote on this proposed Constitutional change at the November General Meeting on Wednesday, November 2, 2022.

MEET YOUR MEMBER JOHN PAUL MAROSY



I first joined the Z Club of America in 1978 when I owned an orange '73 240Z with a black vinyl roof. My brother Pierre was employed as a mechanic by the Z Club of America which was headquartered in New Jersey. At that time, the club operated a performance shop and sponsored a 240Z race car that held the C Production lap record at Watkins Glen, driven by Joe Casella, club president.

I joined the Z Car Club of Colorado shortly after moving here in 2019. I joined because I love the fellowship with other owners who share my passion for Z cars, and I appreciate being a part of Z car history, as well as the tips I gain on performance and appearance mods. Over the years, I've enjoyed the Z Club's Shine and Show gatherings, group rides, and track events. In the future, I'd love to see our club sponsor trips to competition events, like IndyCar, F1, or an IMSA GT series race.

Today, I own and regularly drive a 2010 370Z convertible known as the "Hendri-Z." It is an ArtCar with a purpose. The Hendri-Z is a blast to drive and it attracts attention to the work of Message To Love, www.messagetolove.org, a non-profit organization that collects guitars and amps that people are not using and gives them to kids who can't afford them. We partner with music teachers at Colorado public schools with the highest percentage of kids from low-income families and with non-profit groups serving marginalized youth, like Youth On Record www.youthonrecord.org

The Hendri-Z gives expression to my three passions in life: the breakthrough psychedelic rock music of Jimi Hendrix, fast sports cars, and social justice. Mechanically stock (with 28,000 miles on the odometer), the Hendri-Z is a rolling tribute to Jimi's musical genius and cultural impact.

Three talented artists worked with me to create of the Hendri-Z. Michael Freeman, a super-talented abstract visual artist who shares my passion for Hendrix's music, created four original paintings, each expressing a different phase of Jimi's short, meteoric rise to international stardom. Graphic artist Adam Carnes took digitized images of the paintings and adapted them to the shape of the 370Z. Then, we found Mark Noll, a metal sculptor, who fashioned a copper replica of the guitar that Jimi famously smashed and burned at the Monterey Pop Festival. Mark's guitar graces the rear spoiler (when the car's not being driven).

The top-notch team at PureBlind in Denver created a superb wrap based on the stunning work of the three artists. And this summer, I added an auxiliary Hendri-horn that plays the opening riffs to four of Jimi's songs, along with underlighting for that "floating on a purple cloud" effect in the evening. Tint World of Aurora did the install on those items.

My wife Donna and I and our son Martin (2007 350Z convertible and also a member of the Club) enjoy showing the Hendri-Z at automotive, art, music, and community events. I look forward to meeting more Z Club members in the year to come. Please keep Message To Love in mind if you come across someone who's got and extra guitar or amplifier collecting dust. We know a kid who would love to play it!







COLORADO TIDBITS OF TRIVIA

- + There are 40 species of bats in the United States, 18 of which are found in Colorado.
- Denver has 300 days of bright sunshine a year more annual hours of sun than San Diego, California or Miami Beach, Florida.
- + The world's largest silver nugget, weighing 1,840 pounds, was found in 1894 near Aspen, Colorado.
- + The Durango and Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad has been in continuous operation since 1881 and has appeared in more than a dozen movies including "How the West was Won" (1963) and "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid" (1969).

1968 Datsun 1600 Roadster \$35,000

This beautiful 1968 Datsun 1600 Roadster was restored to its original glory in silver over red upholstery which was paired with a 1.6-liter inline-four is said to have been overhauled and fitted with a 2.0-liter stroker kit. Equipment includes a five-speed manual transmission; rare, dual U20 carburetors; a removable black soft top; refinished chrome bumpers; 14" Minilite wheels; front lowering springs; and an AM radio. This 1600 Roadster is offered by Rhett Trees, a long-time Datsun collector, ZCCC Member to include service records and a clean Montana title.

The polished 14" Minilite alloy wheels wear Kenda Kenetica Touring A/S tires and stopping power is provided by front discs and rear drums.

The interior features low-back bucket seats that have been reupholstered in red vinyl with a matching parcel shelf, door panels, carpets, and lap belts. A plastic dash cap has been installed, and amenities include an AM radio, roll-up windows, and a heater.

A wood-rimmed **Grant GT** steering wheel fronts a 7k-rpm tachometer, a 120-mph speedometer, and gauges for coolant temperature, amperage, oil pressure, and fuel level. The five-digit odometer shows 5k miles, though total mileage is unknown.

The 1.6-liter R16 inline-four was reportedly overhauled and fitted with a 2.0-liter stroker kit in 2019 and equipment includes dual U20 carburetors and a modified R16 intake manifold.

Power is sent to the rear wheels through a five-speed manual transmission that has reportedly been fitted with an upgraded fifth gear. Additional photos available on request. The car resides in Central Denver and is available for viewing at your convenience.


